BEST TIME TO GO?

The best time to visit Mozambique is between June and October, when the weather is hot and relatively dry. Summers, from November to April, tend to be hot and humid, summer is the rainy season with short and brief downpours.

Mozambique has a warm tropical climate with the average temperature throughout the year being a balmy 28C. The coastal areas tend to be sunny year-round.

The average daytime temperature is 32C. January and February is generally the cyclone season.
